SUMMARY

120,000 population, predominantly African Traditional Religion, remote locations, few known Christians, possible persecution for future believers

DETAILS

Who are they? The Ganagana, also known as Dibo, have an estimated population of 120,000.

What is their primary religion? African Traditional Religion mixed with Islam.

Where are they? The Ganagana can be found in the Aza, Kintaku, and Lapai Local Government Area in Niger State. They are also found in Abaji and Kwali Area Councils near Abuja.

Do they have a Christian witness? There are few known Ganagana Christians. There are a few churches in the Ganagana area.

What strategies are being implemented for reaching this people group? None.

Suggestions and rationale for engaging this people group: An Engaging Church from the U.S.A. could begin targeting this people group. This church could begin by doing prayerwalks and more research.

What specific challenges or opportunities could directly affect the engagement of this people group?

- Teams would face remote and primitive living conditions.
- Care would have to be taken to witness to those following Islam in a way that would not bring persecution to them.

Specific Opportunities/Benefits:

- A Nigerian believer who is not Ganagana has been trying to work among them.
