SUMMARY

4,000 population, Islamic with some influence of African Traditional Religion

DETAILS

Who are they? The Komono are Muslims. They have an estimated population of 4,000. Their language is Khisa.

What is their primary religion? Islam mixed with African Traditional Religion

Where are they? The Komono are the primary ethnic group found in six villages in southwest Burkina Faso.

Do they have a Christian witness? There are some churches in the area where the Komono live, but there are no Komono believers in them.

What strategies are being implemented for reaching this people group? None

Suggestions and rationale for engaging this people group: An Engaging Church could take the challenge of engaging the Komono with the Gospel. There are three neighboring groups who could also be engaged along with the Komono; the Khe, the Dogosé and the Dogosé Fing.

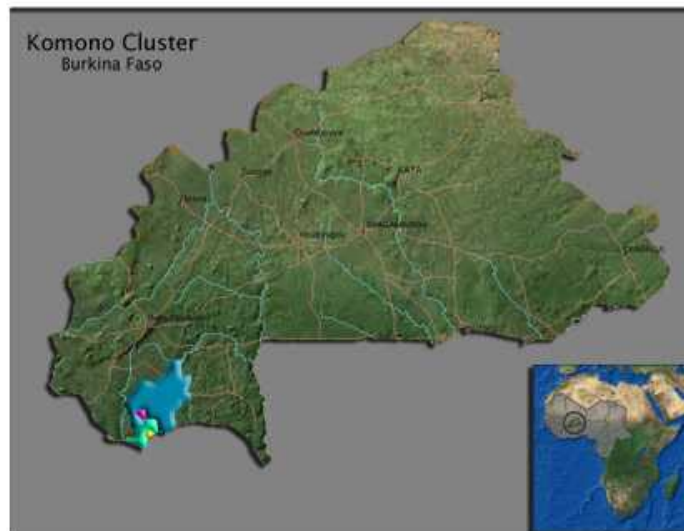
What specific challenges or opportunities could directly affect the engagement of this people?

- Remote and primitive living conditions
- Lack of accessibility, especially during rainy season (June - October)
- No Gospel resources available in Khisa language.
- High level of bilingualism in Jula

Specific Opportunities/Benefits:

- Komono are more accessible than the other groups because of their close proximity to Mangodara town.
- They understand and can use materials in Dogosé and Jula because of a high level of bilingualism.
- There are 3 Dogosé pastors, one with a congregation including three Dogosé believers
